MASTER ARTIST APPRENTICE PROGRAM EXHIBITING IN NASHVILLE & KNOXVILLE

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (October 20, 2015) – For the seventh year, the Tennessee Arts Commission, in partnership with Tennessee Craft, is offering a paid opportunity for emerging craft makers to learn traditional and contemporary craft skills from master-level craftsmen.

In total, six Master Artist Apprentice Program (MAAP) participants will receive \$12,000 to take their craft to the next level using relevant and alternative education experiences. The program ensures the skills and knowledge needed to continue our state's craft heritage live on and that crafts continue to be practiced within our communities, providing livelihoods to makers and raising the cultural and economic vitality of our state. The application deadline for 2016 is October 31 and will open again on August 1, 2016 for the 2017 program. For more information, visit the MAAP page on the Tennessee Craft website.

<u>The Tennessee Arts Commission</u> is currently exhibiting the 2015 Master Artist Apprentice Program Artists until **November 14**. This year's featured work was created from 580 hours of one-on-one mentoring instruction by masters to encourage, strengthen and grow the apprentices' artistic foundation.

Master Scott DeWaard (Walland) and Apprentice Stephen Shankles (Maryville) will also be showing work they created while in the Master Artist Apprentice Program at the 18th Master Woodworkers Show presented by the East Tennessee Woodworkers Guild and the Arts & Culture Alliance, November 6-8, at the Emporium Center in downtown Knoxville. This biennial juried show highlights the handcrafted works of 33 craftspeople and artists of East Tennessee and the surrounding region, featuring many types of woodworking from traditional to whimsical, including fine furniture, cabinetry, turning, sculpture and marquetry.
